Context Fight against Organised Crime

The fight against organised crime is one of the key priorities for Montenegro to move forward toward the EU. Within this context, the EU put into action a twinning project implemented by the Austrian Criminal Intelligence Police to strengthen the institutional and operational capacity of the Montenegrin Police.

Objectives

- Support the implementation of an Intelligence-Led Policing system – a model of policing in which intelligence serves as a guide to operations, rather than the reverse.

Impact The Intelligence-Led Policing System is established and operational

- The Montenegrin Police strengthened its capacity to fight organised and serious crime.
- Threat assessments, control strategies, pro-active investigations and the analysis and process of criminal intelligence data are all being used for this purpose.
- The Police now has an Organised Crime Threat Assessment and control strategy, as well an Organised Crime Mapping. The mapping includes a geographic information system and spatial crime analysis.
- It is now easier for the Police to collect and process criminal intelligence data and to conduct pro-active investigations.
