Almost €3.2 billion EU assistance to Jordan since 2011



Over 168,000 refugee and host community children have received EDUCATION support



660,000 Syrians and Jordanians have received monthly transfers to cover their BASIC NEEDS (health, safety, protection, emergency education)



Over 125,000 Syrians and Jordanians have accessed HEALTH services

The EU responds to the most urgent needs of Syrians in Jordan with:

- Assistance to cover basic needs
- Education
- Access to health care
- Protection activities including legal aid to facilitate civil and status regularisation

It enabled me to get a step closer to my dream of becoming a legal advisor", said Firas, one of the over 657,000 Syrian refugees registered in Jordan (UNHCR, June 2020). The European Union supports young women and men from Syria and Jordan with access to further and higher education opportunities.



The EU creates perspectives for both Syrians and Jordanians in the long term by:

- Supporting Jordan's macro-economic stability and promoting job creation, notably through facilitating trade with the EU
- Supporting Jordan in delivering access to improved education, health care and water services
- Improving the coordination and sustainability of border management, in particular in the Eastern part of Jordan
- Addressing the needs of refugees and Jordanians through the EU Regional Trust Fund in Response to the Syrian Crisis*
