

# EU COOPERATION ON MIGRATION WITH MOROCCO

December 2018

- European cooperation in the field of migration in Morocco spans over 10 years: the EU is Morocco's most longstanding partner in terms of technical and financial support
- Morocco currently holds the second largest cooperation portfolio on migration among the neighbour countries of the EU.
- Ocoperation in the field of migration in Morocco is financed by the European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI), the EU Emergency Trust Fund for Africa (EUTF Africa), and the Development Cooperation Instrument (DCI). EU cooperation instruments feed into the the Mobility Partnership between the EU and Morocco.
- With the establishment of the EUTF Africa at the Valetta Summit in 2015, the efforts of the EU and its Member States in supporting the Moroccan national migration strategy have substantially increased.






#### Supporting inclusive development

Via the European Neighbourhood Instrument, the Commission has mobilised €1 billion since 2014 to support:



- Equitable access to basic social services
- Wider employment opportunities, and sustainable and inclusive growth
- Democratic governance, rule of law and mobility
- Civil society organisations



#### **EXAMPLES OF RESULTS**

7,400

Migrant women and girls have received social, medical and psychological support 2,200

Migrants receive information / training in job search / entrepreneurship skills 400

Refugees and migrants receive funding for their entrepreneurship projects 1,400

Minor migrants benefit from schooling **600** 

Migrants (40% women and girls) attend literacy classes 2,000

Minor migrants are informed on their rights and have access to social services

5,800

Migrants will benefit from voluntary return (from 2017 to 2019)
