2. PRIORITY AXES / PROJECTS

2.1. Priority axes

The IPA 2008 programme for Albania focuses on the objectives identified in the Multi-Annual Planning Document (MIPD) 2008-2010. The 24 projects of the programme are grouped under 4 strategic priority axes. Assistance under this programme responds to the

recommendations of the 2007 Enlargement Strategy and Progress Report, the European Partnership priorities and will address the requirements under the SAA.

IPA 2008 will address key issues such as public administration reform and rule of law enforcement, in particular as regards good governance and anti-corruption measures. This reflects the increase of funds allocated to the area of political requirements under MIPD 2008-2010. Strengthening the administrative capacity in view of the implementation of the SAA is given a high priority to support the Albanian authorities in fulfilling the requirements of the SAA. There is a need to further support structural reforms in the country and to invest in related infrastructure, in particular in the area of regional development and acquis related infrastructure.

2.1.1. Priority Axis 1 - Political Criteria

31% of the overall budget for the 2008 programme should be allocated to this axis. IPA will support the current *public administration reform* through the institutions involved in the civil service management, mainly the Department of Public Administration (DoPA). In order to improve Albania's *administrative capacity*, assistance is given to the overall co-ordination structures to manage the SAA implementation process (Ministry of European Integration (MEI), Council of Ministers (CoM) and line ministries) strengthening as well the capacity of key institutions, in particular the Ministry of Public Works, Transport and Telecommunications. Further assistance to *good governance* is provided supporting anti-corruption measures and strengthening the public financial management, particularly Treasury system and public procurement. Under this heading IPA also contributes to the alignment of *customs* procedures with EU standards. Support to the *judiciary* is provided through the construction of a pre-trial detention centre in Shkodra. A Project Preparation Facility should assist the authorities for future programming and drafting exercises.

2.1.2. Priority Axis 2 – Socio-economic Criteria

26% of the overall budget for the 2008 programme should be allocated to this axis. Under this heading, there is a need to support further structural reforms in the country (i.e regional development type of activities) in terms of infrastructures. In order to contribute to the social and economic cohesion of the country, IPA will support the improvement of management and conditions of the *secondary and local roads* and the implementation of the National Education Strategy with special focus in *up-grading the Vocational Education and Training (VET)* schools. DG ELARG decided to transfer IPA funds from Component II to Component I to continue with a unilateral border *development programme for Kukes region*.

2.1.3. Priority Axis 3 – Ability to assume the obligations of membership

40% of the overall budget for the 2008 programme should be allocated to this axis. IPA will support Albania's approximation to EU standards, including administrative capacity and *compliance with SAA requirements* as regards copyrights, metrology, competition, state aid and civil aviation. Support will be provided to the Bank of Albania. As regards *sectoral policies*, IPA will support the development of a rural development strategy and related structures, monitoring control and surveillance system (fisheries), management system for environmental monitoring and control of animal diseases. Further assistance is foreseen in the area of transport: inter-urban trans-urban highways and port of Shengjin.

2.1.4. Priority Axis 4 – Participation in Community Programmes

2% of the overall budget for the 2008 programme should be allocated to this axis. Participation to the following Community Programmes is foreseen: CIP, FP7 and Europe for Citizens.

Projects under the IPA Multi-Beneficiary Programme 2008 will be funded from the national budget for the areas of education (Tempus: EUR 1 million) and Nuclear Safety (EUR 200 000).

2.3. Overview of past and on-going assistance (EU/ IFI /Bilateral) including lessons learned and donor coordination

2.3.1. Past and on-going assistance

Between 2001 and 2006 Albania benefited from around EUR 330 million of CARDS assistance. CARDS assistance targeted four broad reform priorities: justice and home affairs (about 40% of the funding), administrative capacity building (about 20%), economic and social development (about 35%), and democratic stabilisation (about 5%).

Under CARDS, the management of EC projects has been transferred to the EC Delegation in Tirana. The EC Delegation works in close cooperation with the Albanian Ministry of European Integration.

The support provided through CARDS 2005/2006 and IPA 2007 is currently being implemented and there is a pipeline of projects in the areas of good governance and institution building, rule of law, civil society, education, employment, European standards, regional development, transport, environment, agriculture, rural development, SMEs, statistics and taxation.

The IPA 2007 national programme addresses under the political criteria: police reform, decentralised management of the assistance, and penitentiary infrastructure. Under the economic criteria, the national programme 2007 addresses SME development and the priority axis on European Standards included projects on statistics, water supply and sewerage systems and taxation. The total allocation of the 2007 national programme is EUR 49.2 million.

Albania also benefited from the regional activities under CARDS, which supported actions of common interest for the Western Balkan region in the fields of infrastructure, institution

building and cross-border cooperation in conjunction with Interreg activities. Under IPA regional activities are covered by the Multi-beneficiary programme as regards public administration reform, justice and home affairs, civil society, youth, education, research, infrastructure, internal market and nuclear safety.

2.3.2. Lessons learned

The interim evaluations (Phare 1999-2002) and the ex-post evaluation (Phare 1999-2001) of EU pre-accession assistance have identified some lessons that can be drawn for future assistance. Experiences with the implementation of CARDS and IPA assistance as well as recent DG ELARG evaluation reports - more specifically, the evaluation report for public administration reform, suggest that IPA assistance needs to consider the following lessons learned:

- Local ownership is essential for the effective targeting of assistance and achieving the expected results. Significant efforts have been undertaken to involve Albania's institutions in the planning and programming process for EC assistance. The Ministry for European Integration (MEI) benefited from substantial institution and capacity building support. The introduction of the function of Senior Programme Officers (SPO) within the European Integration units in line ministries and the leading role of the MEI in the programming process should provide the framework for the identification of the assistance needs.
- The absorption capacity of the authorities needs to be ensured. This depends on project maturity, adequate staffing in the relevant institutions and the mobilisation of the civil society and a political consensus on key reform activities.
- Timely planning of future assistance is essential to address key areas. Given the
 delays in the implementation of CARDS and IPA assistance, it needs to be ensured
 that projects do not become obsolete because of late implementation.
- The link between EC assistance and sectoral strategies and action plans of the Albanian institutions needs to be ensured. The aim is to design assistance in relation to the Albania strategic plans, which should address the requirements of the EU integration process.

 Particular attention must be paid to the preparedness and maturity of the projects to be selected.

2.3.3. Donor Coordination

Since November 2005, the Government of Albania is involved in the process of donor coordination through the Integrated Planning System (IPS), which aims at ensuring that core policy and financial processes function in a coherent, efficient and integrated manner. Assistance to this mechanism is foreseen under IPA 2007. The Albanian Government also expects to improve donor coordination and align international assistance with national priorities through the Department of Strategy and Donor Coordination (DSDC) under the Council of Ministers. The Minister of European Integration has been appointed as National IPA Co-ordinator.

The Delegation of the European Commission, in its role as head of the Donor Technical Secretariat (DTS), has facilitated coordination hosting project data of all donors since 2003. For the last two years this role was undertaken by the World Bank. As from 1st April 2008 the EC will be again leading the DTS.

Beside the EC assistance, several other donors are active in key areas of assistance. Support to the public administration reform is mainly provided by Austria, Germany, Netherlands, Sweden, and the United States. In the sector of rule of law and security, assistance is provided by France, Italy, Sweden, Council of Europe, Organisation for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE), and Norway. Economic development is promoted by Austria, France, Italy, Spain, and UK. Education, employment and health are supported by Austria, the Czech Republic, France, Italy, and the United Nations. Assistance to European Standards (including food safety, energy, agriculture, and environment) is provided by Austria, Germany, the Czech Republic, Italy, Japan, and USAID. Investments in infrastructure projects (including roads, railway, waterways and air transport) are mainly provided by Austria, the Czech Republic, Germany, Italy, and Switzerland.

2.4. Cross cutting issues

The major cross cutting issues to be tackled in Albania are:

- Civil Society is supported from previous CARDS 2005/2006 programmes (currently under implementation) and the European Initiative for Democracy and Human Rights (EIDHR). Civil Society should be properly consulted by the government during the decision making process.
- **Environmental impact assessment** is compulsory concerning new legislation and financing proposals for investments.
- Equal opportunities and non-discrimination will be respected as regarding gender at the programming and implementation stage, particularly in relation to socioeconomic support programmes.
- Minority and vulnerable groups' concerns will be reflected in all activities programmed under IPA, in particular when it concerns public services, legislative matters and socio-economic development.

 Good governance and fight against corruption: Specific action instruments for the good governance, with particular attention to fight against corruption, will be incorporated on a horizontal basis.

2.5. Conditions

The programme includes the following conditionalities:

- The projects fiches are formally approved by exchange of letter between the Commission and the government of Albania.
- The government will ensure that the beneficiary institutions have adequate financial, material and human resources in order that the EC financial support is used in the most effective and sustainable manner possible.
- Beneficiary institutions will formally endorse the design and tender documents, including terms of reference.
- Beneficiary institutions organise, select and appoint members (including gender and ethnic balance) of working groups, steering and coordination committees, and seminars as required by the project activities.

Additional project specific conditions are described in the project fiches. In the event that these conditions are not met, suspension or cancellation of the project or specific activities will be considered.

2.7. Roadmap for the decentralisation of the management of EU funds without ex ante controls by the Commission

The preparations for the Decentralised Implementation System need to be based on previous experience with decentralised management under Phare. The Albanian authorities decided in 2007 to stop working with the previous decentralised set up under Phare for the Local Community Development Programme and instead started preparations for the full

decentralisation of the EU funds. The capacities previously developed in the Programme Management Units under Phare need to be integrated in the new set-up of DIS structures in Albania. Sigma assistance during 2008 in this area will be given follow-up with IPA 2007 project.

3.2. Principle of Co-Financing applying to the projects funded under the programme

The Community contribution, which represents 90.69 % of the total budget allocated to this programme, has been calculated in relation to the eligible expenditure, which in the case of centralised management is based on the total expenditure. Parallel co-financing will be used.

In the case of grants, final grant beneficiaries should contribute with a minimum of 10% of the eligible expenditure of the project, both for investment and institution building projects, and a minimum of 5% of the eligible expenditure in case of twinning.

Overall, co-financing is foreseen for 11 out of 24 projects and amounts to 5.7 % for priority axis 1 – political criteria, 11.1 % for priority axis 2 – economic criteria, 10.76 % for priority axis 3 – ability to assume the obligations of membership and 9.12 % for priority axis 4-participation in community programmes..

Under priority axis 1 – political criteria, there is 1 % co-financing for institution-building and 11 % co-financing for investments. Under priority axis 2 – economic criteria, a co-financing rate of 12 % is foreseen for the investment part and a co-financing rate of 4 % is attributed to institution-building which constitutes only a small part of the activities under this priority axis (EUR 1.45 million of EUR 18.017 million). Under the third priority axis, co-financing for institution-building amounts to 9 % and for investments co-financing amounts to 12 %. Under priority axis four, co-financing for institution building amounts to 9.12 %. Under this priority axis there is no investment foreseen.

4. IMPLEMENTATION ARRANGEMENTS

4.1. Method of implementation

The programme will be implemented through three different management modes: centralised management, indirect centralised and joint management, in accordance with Article 53a, Article 54 and Article 53d of the Financial Regulation⁷ and the corresponding provisions of the Implementing Rules⁸, respectively. The programme will be implemented by the European Commission Delegation in Tirana.

Based on both, the added value that the Commission may draw from the established expertise of the Member State public-sector bodies Deutsche Gesellschaft fur Technische Zusammenarbeit (GTZ) and the Austrian Development Agency (ADA) in implementing institution building projects in Albania, and the long term continuity of their activities in this country, it is appropriate to delegate to GTZ and ADA the implementation of the following projects through indirect centralized management, in accordance with Article 54.2(c) of the Financial Regulation:

GTZ: Support to strengthen Albania's administrative capacity to manage and coordinate the SAA implementation process (Project number 1), Support to Civil Service Reform (Project number 3) and Capacity building for implementing the rural development strategy (Project number 14).

ADA: Support and Expansion of the Albanian Treasury System (Project number 5) and Project Preparation Facility (Project number 9).

According to audits executed in 2008 by the Commission, GTZ and ADA comply with the criteria provided for in Article 56 of the Financial Regulation.

The contractual framework to be signed with GTZ and ADA will fully observe the conditions laid down in Article 56 of the Financial Regulation and Articles 38, 39 and 41 of its Implementing Rules. To this end, the standard model for European Community Delegation Agreement for indirect method of implementation published in the AIDCO website (version 2008) will be used. The Commission and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) have jointly elaborated the Project "Kukes Region Tourism and Environment Promotion" project number 12. Both entities have also assessed its feasibility and defined the implementation arrangements, in accordance within Article 53d of the Financial Regulation. Therefore, this Project will be implemented through joint management.

The contractual framework to be signed with the UNDP will fully observe the conditions laid down in Articles 53d of the Financial Regulation and Article 43 of its Implementing Rules. For the UNDP, the standard Contribution Agreement for International Organizations published in the AIDCO website (revised version of 2007) will thus supplement the Financial and Administrative Framework Agreement signed in April 2003 between the European Commission and the United Nations Organization.

4.2. General rules for procurement and grant award procedures

Procurement shall follow the provisions of Part Two, Title IV of the Financial Regulation and Part Two, Title III, Chapter 3 of its Implementing Rules as well as the rules and procedures for service, supply and works contracts financed from the general budget of the European Communities for the purposes of cooperation with third countries adopted by the Commission on 24 May 2007 C(2007)2034).

Grant award procedures shall follow the provisions of Part One, Title VI of the Financial Regulation and Part One, Title VI of its Implementing Rules.

The Commission shall also use the procedural guidelines and standard templates and models facilitating the application of the above rules provided for in the "<u>Practical Guide to contract procedures for EC external actions</u>" ("Practical Guide") as published on the EuropeAid website⁹ at the date of the initiation of the procurement or grant award procedure.

4.3. Implementation Principles for Twinning Projects

Twinning projects shall be set up in the form of a grant agreement, whereby the selected Member State administrations agree to provide the requested public sector expertise against the reimbursement of the expenses thus incurred.

The contract may in particular provide for the long-term secondment of an official assigned to provide full-time advice to the administration of the beneficiary country as resident twinning advisor.

4.4. Environmental Impact Assessment and Nature Conservation

All investments shall be carried out in compliance with the relevant Community environmental legislation.

In particular, an Environmental Impact Assessment in line with EU standards shall be carried out for the projects if appropriate ¹⁰.

An appropriate nature conservation assessment shall be made for any project, equivalent to that provided for in Art. 6 of the Habitats Directive¹¹, that is likely to affect sites of nature conservation importance.

5. MONITORING AND EVALUATION

5.1. Monitoring

The Commission may undertake any actions it deems necessary to monitor the programmes concerned. These actions may be carried out jointly with the international organisation(s) concerned

5.2. Evaluation

Programmes shall be subject to ex ante evaluations, as well as interim and, where relevant, ex post evaluations in accordance with Articles 57 and 82 of IPA Implementing Regulation, with the aim of improving the quality, effectiveness and consistency of the assistance from Community funds and the strategy and implementation of the programmes.

The results of ex ante and interim evaluation shall be taken into account in the programming and implementation cycle.

The Commission may also carry out strategic evaluations.

6. AUDIT, FINANCIAL CONTROL AND ANTI-FRAUD MEASURES

The accounts and operations of all parties involved in the implementation of this programme, as well as all contracts and agreements implementing this programme, are subject to, on the one hand, the supervision and financial control by the Commission (including the European Anti-Fraud Office), which may carry out checks at its discretion, either by itself or through an

outside auditor and, on the other hand, audits by the European Court of Auditors. This includes measures such as ex-ante verification of tendering and contracting carried out by the Delegation in the Beneficiary Country.

In order to ensure the efficient protection of the financial interests of the Community, the Commission (including the European Anti-Fraud Office) may conduct on-the-spot checks and inspections in accordance with the procedures foreseen in Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) 2185/96¹².

The controls and audits described above are applicable to all contractors, subcontractors and grant beneficiaries who have received Community funds.

7. LIMITED CHANGES

Limited changes in the implementation of this programme affecting essential elements listed under Article 90 of the Implementing Rules to the Financial Regulation, which are of an indicative nature ¹³, may be undertaken by the authorising officer by delegation (AOD), or by the authorising officer by sub-delegation (AOSD), in line with the delegation of powers conferred upon him by the AOD, in accordance with the principles of sound financial management without an amending financing decision being necessary.
