Growth Plan for the Western Balkans

In 2023, the EU announced a landmark **Growth Plan** to accelerate Western Balkans partners' socio-economic development and EU integration.

The Plan aims to boost **socio-economic convergence** through enhanced economic integration with the **EU's single market**, regional integration within the **Common Regional Market**, accelerating fundamental reforms.

As part of this Growth Plan, Bosnia and Herzegovina was invited to prepare a **Reform Agenda** focusing on reforms to **unlock national and regional growth potential** and related to the fundamentals of the enlargement process, including the **rule of law, democracy, the respect of human rights and fundamental freedoms**.

A €6 billion **Reform and Growth Facility** for the Western Balkans will support implementation of the Growth Plan. For Bosnia and Herzegovina, **€1.085 billion in non-repayable grants and favourable Ioans** will be available **when** it meets the conditions it has committed to in its own Reform Agenda.

Ongoing EU support for Bosnia and Herzegovina

The EU is the largest provider of financial assistance to

Bosnia and Herzegovina. It offers a variety of programmes and instruments to support its development and EU accession process.

Instrument for Pre-Accession (IPA)

Between 2021-2024 the EU has allocated over €309 million of financial and technical assistance to Bosnia and Herzegovina under IPA III. Assistance is provided in the form of non-repayable grants. This includes:

- €70 million Energy Support Package to support vulnerable families and SMEs against rising energy prices.
- €23 million EU4people programme for employment and social inclusion.
- €13 million EU4 Rule of Law and Equality programme to improve the quality of justice and support gender equality and inclusion of the Roma.

Economic & Investment Plan (EIP)

The EU's **EIP for the Western Balkans** identifies 10 flagship investments in sustainable transport, clean energy, environment and climate, digital future, human capital and the private sector, to support a green and digital transition and bring the region closer to **the EU's single market**.

For projects in **Bosnia and Herzegovina**, since 2020 the EU has mobilised **€2.9 billion in investments thanks to €1 billion in EU grants**. Funds are raised through tools such as the Western Balkans Investment Framework (WBIF). This includes:

- Constructing 212 km of new motorways along Corridor Vc, connecting the country to the Adriatic Sea & to Central Europe which should increase travel speed to 130 km/h and improve mobility for 1.5 million people.
- Rehabilitation and modernisation of the Čapljina pump storage hydropower plant, with an expected 20% increased production of 575 GWh per year.
- Building a regional sanitary landfill for Živinice, Banovici and Kladanj, providing efficient waste collection and disposal services for over 151 300 people, with 16 140 tonnes of waste per year disposed of in compliance with EU standards.



The EU is Bosnia and Herzegovina's main trading partner. In 2023, the EU accounted for 64.2% of its trade in goods (73% of total exports and 59% of total imports). Total EU Foreign Direct Investment reached €754.3 million in 2022*.

Under the **Stabilisation and Association Agreement** (SAA) and its Interim Agreement there has been progressive **trade** liberalisation and mutual duty-free access for most goods since 2008.



Foreign & security policy cooperation

Bosnia and Herzegovina has continued to fully align on EU's **Common Foreign and Security Policy** positions and declarations.

In addition:

- Bosnia and Herzegovina continued to participate in EU crisis management missions and operations under the Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP).
- The Armed Forces of Bosnia and Herzegovina benefit from €20 million in assistance from the European Peace Facility, which increases their capacity to participate in Common Security and Defence Policy military missions and operations.
- The EU provides support to strengthen Bosnia and Herzegovina's resilience to hybrid threats, including cyber threats and foreign information manipulation and interference.



- Since 2010, Bosnia and Herzegovina benefits from visa-free travel to the EU.
- The EU has funded over 11 500 exchanges between EU and Bosnia and Herzegovina citizens in the areas of education, training, youth, and sport under ERASMUS+ (2014-2020).
