Context

The Jean Monnet Scholarship Programme was launched under an agreement signed between Turkey and the European Commission. Turkish youth, public officers, representatives of NGOs and private sector employees have the opportunity to study in EU member countries.

Objectives

 Support Turkey strengthen its administrative capacity for the implementation of EU acquis, by having highly-trained specialists on EU topics.

Impact

- The programme enabled approximately 1,200 new graduates, civil servants, and private sector employees to acquire knowledge and skills on EU related issues. Up to now, scholarship holders studied in 13 countries.
- The Programme supports academic study at graduate or research level at a university or similar institution in one of the EU member states.
