2 RATIONALE

2.1 PROJECT CONTEXT: ISSUES TO BE TACKLED AND NEEDS ADDRESSED

The justification for this project comes from the need of the Albania administration to ensure: (i) support to the different line Ministries and state institutions for EU *acquis* related reforms, in particular with a view to the 2010 Commission Opinion key priorities fulfilment, and (ii) assistance in preparation of IPA project proposals, as well as in the move towards IPA support in the form of sector wide approach.

The pre-accession period, and particularly the fulfilment of the 2010 Commission Opinion key priorities, requires an increasing number of quality expertise and EU knowledge in judicial, economic and political matters. Furthermore, it is necessary to establish or strengthen administrative structures and management systems which satisfy the requirements of the EU acquis in a number of areas. Implementing bodies may lack the necessary expertise, knowledge and experience to carry out these tasks. Therefore, it is essential to create an envelope for unspecified institution building needs (e.g. training, technical assistance, etc.). This envelope will cover a series of demand-driven requests such as short term twinning and

technical assistance, which could include as well study visits to EU Member States, attendance to accession related conferences and meetings/workshops by the Albanian administration. This support will allow project preparation and implementation in a quick and effective manner. Also, this support will be able to cover unforeseen emerging needs, which might stem from the development of the political situation in the country, in particular with view to the post-election period in 2013.

2.2 LINK WITH MIPD AND NATIONAL SECTOR STRATEGIES

Chapter 3.2.3. of the MIPD 2011-2013 on Public Administration Reform outlines as specific objectives to support horizontally the sectors of the administration responsible for implementation of the Stabilization and Association Agreement provisions and those involved in implementation of the EU financial assistance, including preparation for the Decentralised Implementation System (DIS) and to improve (i) policy coordination/strategic planning, (ii) policy framework alignment with European Integration Agenda and (iii) medium term budget planning at the central and line ministries level.

Furthermore, the MIPD foresees a number of priority sectors in the area of transport, environment, as well as social development and agriculture. Therefore, one of the MIPD priorities is to support *acquis*-related issues, in particular, administrative capacity, adoption and enforcement of legislation, as well as preparation of projects pipeline for investments in the transport sector, social sector, as well as in the environment and agriculture sectors.

2.3 LINK WITH ACCESSION PARTNERSHIP (AP) / EUROPEAN PARTNERSHIP (EP) / STABILISATION AND ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT (SAA) / ANNUAL PROGRESS REPORT

The facility will enhance the authorities' ability to prepare projects that help Albania meet the full range of its priorities deriving from the European Partnership and Multi-annual Indicative Planning Document, as well as from the Stabilization and Association Agreement (SAA). This project has been designed in a flexible manner to support also the initiatives contributing to such projects.

The Commission Opinion 2010 on Albania's application for membership of the EU included 12 Key Priorities, which require for their fulfilment an enhanced capacity amongst many departments in key line ministries.

The Progress Report of 2012 mentions several needs for further enhancing *acquis* compliance related to investments in the environment, transport, and energy sectors. The support to address these needs require feasibility, design, and other studies covered by the present project.

2.4 PROBLEM ANALYSIS

As mentioned in the last Progress Report, despite the overall progress done during the last years, the overall capacity of the Ministry of European Integration and Line Ministries still needs to be strengthened. This project aims to improve technical capacity in the preparation and implementation of activities defined in IPA programmes and in the National Action Plan for the 2010 Commission Opinion Key Priorities. Support is needed to build the necessary project pipeline as well as capacities of relevant Line Ministries in project management and monitoring.

The activities and tasks listed under this project serve the purpose of supporting EU *acquis* alignment and implementation through creation of an envelope for unspecified institution building needs.

The facility also foresees support for the annual programming of IPA financial assistance. Technical expertise will be mobilized in case where an initial project proposal is considered to correspond to a sector priority according to the MIPD, but where further efforts are needed to design mature projects ready for implementation under the ongoing or upcoming IPA financial assistance programmes.

The Ministry of European Integration and Line Ministries need to better plan national and IPA financial resources in the frame of a coherent and effective sector approach. In this respect, the project will mobilize expertise to define projects and sector programs, which can concretely support the implementation of national sector policies. This exercise needs to be fully coherent with the Government medium term budget perspective and with the external assistance provided by other donors.

Another area where additional short-term interventions in Albania are required is related to the preparation and implementation of the EU financed projects. In many cases thorough project implementation documentation in the form of tender dossiers, technical specifications or terms of reference need to be drafted in order to initiate the tender procedures for acquiring the services, works or supplies required.

2.5 LINKED ACTIVITIES AND DONOR COORDINATION

Under IPA 2008 the Ministry of European Integration and Line Ministries have already benefited from the technical expertise mobilized in the frame of the Project Preparation Facility (PPF), implemented through indirect centralized management with Austrian Development Agency (ADA). This Project Preparation Facility has already been extended with funds under IPA 2009 and IPA 2010.

The Ministry of European Integration and Line Ministries can also currently benefit from a Project Preparation Facility, directly managed by the EU Delegation under IPA 2012. The aim of the facility is to produce a mature projects pipeline to be funded under IPA or in the frame of national sector strategies or in the frame of other donors assistance programmes.

2.6 Lessons learned

In the previous programming exercises it appeared that the programming process is still partly suffering of weak technical capacity and specialised expertise of the beneficiary institutions of IPA support. The availability of specialised expertise will further improve the programming identification and implementation, in particular with the move towards more sector approach.

At the same time, a continous challenge remains: some of institutions have been hampered by lack of appropriate capacities, including high turn over of staff. In this regard, the project will provide sufficient support in order to strengthen current capacities in the Ministry of European Integration, line ministries and other appropriate bodies both for coordination of legal approximation, drafting/implementation of legislation as well as project implementation.

3 DESCRIPTION

3.1 OVERALL OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

The overall objective of this project is to strengthen the capacity and accountability of the Ministry of European Integration and Line Ministries and to ensure a sustainable role of GoA in the planning, programming and implementation of the IPA national programme.

3.2 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE(S) OF THE PROJECT

The objective of the project is to increase the maturity of proposals for projects and sector programs to be proposed for future EU funding, as well as to provide ad hoc interventions for EU *acquis* reforms.

3.3 RESULTS

Result 1: Preparation of well justified, mature and good-quality project or sector proposals, tender documentations or other feasibility studies and proper and timely implementation of IPA programmes supported.

3.4 MAIN ACTIVITIES

- 1.1. Conduct *acquis* related studies (needs and gap analyses, action plan drafting, strategy development, legal assessments, training, etc.). through service contracts or twining light projects with EU Member States
- 1.2. Within the twinning light or technical assistance projects organisation of training, study-visits, management, organizational and other expert advice to support beneficiary institutions in developing / upgrading necessary *acquis* related technical know-how and management skills
- 1.3. Support in preparation of project documentation as well as any analysis, study, survey, review, assessment or monitoring that is in relation with Albania's EU accession process and/or pre-accession instruments.
- 1.4. Support measures related to urgent political needs that may arise from the fulfilment of the Key Priorities and/or the political development in the country.

Activities 1.1 to 1.4 will be implemented through several twinning lights or service contracts or supply contracts or specific contracts under existing framework contracts.

3.5 ASSESSMENT OF PROJECT IMPACT, CATALYTIC EFFECT AND CROSS BORDER IMPACT

Projects that will be finance under this envelope will bring technical knowledge, best practices, recommendations, organisation plans, training plans which will be translated in appropriate changes in the legal framework and incorporated the daily work of the Albanian institutions.

The project is likely to result in better performance of the Government and Governmental institutions in the fulfilment of its functions, and in better inter-institutional cooperation.

The project is expected to improve the quality of managing EU pre-accession assistance, both in terms of effectiveness and efficiency. The expected outcomes will result in reduced levels of rejection of procurement documentation/transaction submitted to the EU Delegation (with

view to expected conferral of management powers in 2013 for Component I). As far as the long term effects are concerned, it is expected that the project will contribute to an increase in the overall absorption rate of EU pre-accession assistance.

3.6 SUSTAINABILITY

The foreseen impact of the project is better programming and enhanced ownership and sustainability of IPA projects. The present support could also be used for follow up, monitoring and evaluations (technical and financial) of projects in order to ensure efficiency, effectiveness and impact in line with the identified objectives and in line with EU financial regulations.

3.7 ASSUMPTIONS AND PRE-CONDITIONS

One main condition required for this project is that Albanian Line Ministries are sufficiently staffed and IPA contact points, including Senior Programme Officers, remain committed to the process. Relevant human and financial resources will be allocated by the Albanian Authorities.

4 IMPLEMENTATION ISSUES

Activities 1.1. to 1.4. will be implemented in centralised management through several twinning lights or service contracts or supply contracts or specific contracts under existing framework contracts.

A Steering Committee (SC) will assist the selection of individual projects to be potentially financed under IPA programmes. The Steering Committee will be co-chaired by the MEI and EUD. Potential applicants will be obliged to submit project proposals for agreement and approval to the SC. The potential project proposals should be submitted based on the priorities defined in Needs Assessment Documents, MIPD, Key Priorities Action Plan or annual EC Progress Reports. Projects will be submitted first in the form of concepts and will be assessed by the EUD and MEI. After EUD/MEI initial approval of a project concept, the project will be developed in the full format and submitted to the Steering Committee for approval. EUD and MEI will prepare the rules of procedures for the functioning of the Steering Committee. These rules of procedures will regulate relevant procedure and applicable templates.
