## 2. Description of the project

On the basis of Association Council decisions or Framework Agreements, candidate countries may participate in certain European Community programmes and agencies.

Pre-accession financial assistance can be used to help a candidate country to meet part of the costs of participation in those programmes and agencies, on the basis of an increasing contribution from the Candidate Country. A maximum of 10% of Pre-accession financial assistance available for national programme funding may be used to co-finance participation in Community programmes and agencies. Participation in the R&D Programme does not count towards the 10% limit.

The Community's grant assistance will be made available each year for the country so as to co-finance the financial contribution to be paid by the country to participate in the programmes and agencies in the following year.

This project fiche for the shows Community support for the country's participation, *inter alia*, in the programmes and agencies listed in the table below for the year 2010.

The EU agreed in the Thessaloniki Agenda to open participation in Community Programmes up to the Western Balkan countries, following the approach used in the past for candidate countries. The Commission proposed concrete steps in its Communication of 3 December 2003<sup>1</sup>, underlining the need for a selective and gradual approach.

The beneficiaries have expressed their interest to participate, inter alia, in the following **Community Programmes in the medium term**:

Also, the beneficiaries would like to retain the right to participate in other programmes and agencies which will be identified in a later stage.

Prior to the participation in the Community Programmes on Life-long Learning and Youth in Action a national agency for managing these programmes was established (supported through national funds and IPA 2007 funds). The National Agency for European Programmes in the field of Education and Mobility is expected to be accredited and fully functional during 2010.

The participation of the beneficiaries in Community Programmes follows specific terms and conditions set out for each such programme in a so called Memorandum of Understanding (MoU). Such a MoU has already been concluded (by the beneficiary and the Commission) with regard to:

- the 7th Research Framework Programme
- PROGRESS
- CIP-EIP
- Culture Programme

#### 3. Conditionality and sequencing:

Co-financing of entry tickets for participating in a certain programme will only be progressed once a respective MoU between the Commission and the beneficiary has been signed. Prior to the participation in the Community Programmes Life-long Learning and Youth in Action the relevant national agency must be fully operational, which is expected to be done in 2010.

With regard to participation in community agencies the following conditionality is to be added: Prior to the participation in the corresponding community agency, the Agency will assess whether the country is ready to participate in the Agency as an observer, following the country's participation in actions to prepare the country for this participation. Prior to its full participation as observer, the country may use the funds to cover its cost for participation in activities.

## 5. Implementation Arrangements

- 5.1. Contracting Authority: European Commission (EC Delegation in Skopje).
- 5.2. The various Commission services responsible for the different programmes will send to the Mission of the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to the EU a request for the total financial contribution for the participation in a given programme or agency ("call for funds"). The country shall pay its total financial contribution to each programme ("entry-ticket") within the deadline requested in the call for funds. In principle, this payment will be made by the sectoral ministry in charge of the programme concerned. When making the payment for each programme, the authority in charge should quote the reference number indicated in the call for funds for the programme concerned, and send simultaneously a copy of the payment order to the relevant Commission service.
- 5.3. Following the entry into force of the Financing Agreement, the National IPA Coordinator send to the Commission a request for funds for the reimbursement of the IPA part of the entry-tickets paid by the country, together with proofs of payment. The Commission signs the commitment for the IPA part of each entry-ticket and transfers the IPA funds to the country as reimbursement on the basis of the request for funds and proof of payment. The National IPA Coordinator then transfer the amount of the IPA support for each programme to the authority which made the payment of the financial contribution to the programme concerned.
