An Explanatory Note on the Indicator Charts and Analysis

This annex presents more detailed information on each of the indicators (from the Facility Results Framework) which are reported upon in this FMR. This includes recent indicator values, targets, baselines, achievement rates, and changes since the previous report (FMR-10). The information is presented using dashboard graphics from the SUMAF data management system.

For those indicators with historical data, we present trends over time to help the reader's understanding of performance over time. Where data relates to specific provinces we present it using a 'heat map' (where colour density relates to the indicator value). This method of visual analysis simplifies the comprehension of geographical data and highlights the top ten provinces in terms of progress achieved. Additionally, to provide a more granular understanding, we present disaggregated data for the majority of the indicators (e.g. by gender, nationality, age group, etc.).

The 'Change since last report' section presents any updates on new data or changes that have emerged since the last FMR (e.g., FMR 10). For instance, during the latter half of 2022, we witnessed an increase of 15,083 refugee children receiving catch-up training. This change was calculated by subtracting the Q2/2022 value (90,888) from the Q4/2022 value (105,971). In instances where data for a particular indicator was not available in Q2/2022 (the cut-off date for the previous FMR), we have relied on the most recent previously reported value for comparison. For example, for the indicator 'proportion of reproductive-age women expressing an unmet need for reproductive health services', the change is reported as -19.5. This figure is derived by subtracting the previously reported value of 36.9 (in Q3/2020) from the current value of 17.4 (in Q4/2022).














H-Oc.06 Number of hospital beds per 10,000 population





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













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








C-Ot.03 Number of refugees and host community members who participated in (Facility-supported) inter-community social cohesion events
