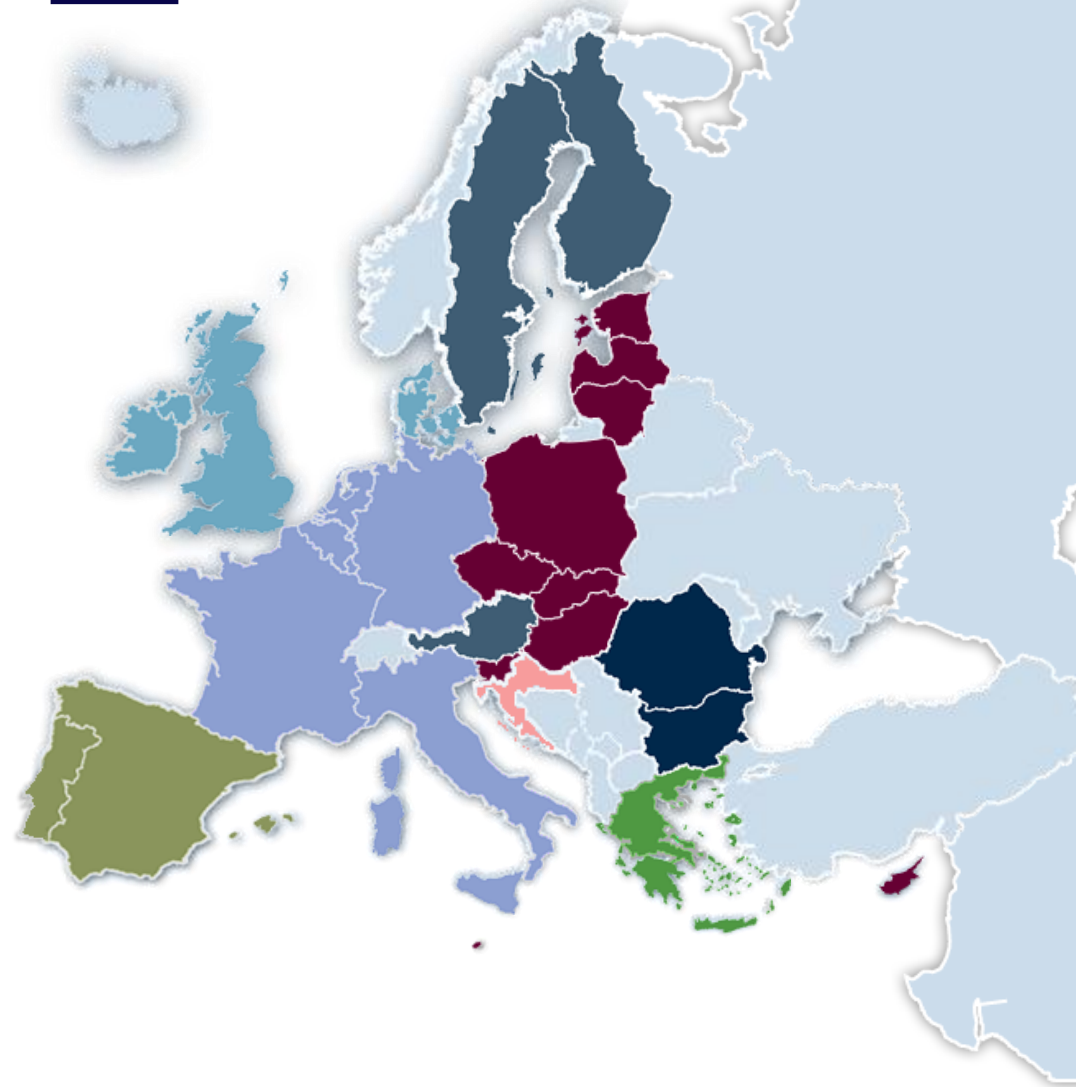

Copenhagen criteria (1993)

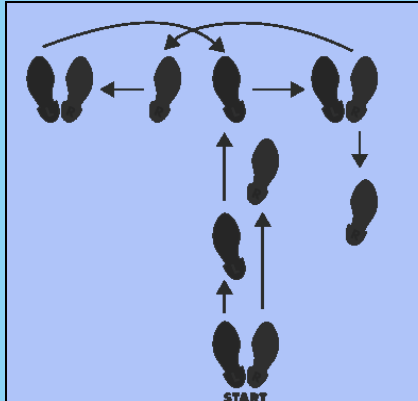
- Political
 - Stable democratic institutions
 - Human rights, protection of minorities
 - Rule of law
- Economic
 - Functioning market economy
 - Capacity to cope with competitive forces in EU
- Ability to take on obligations of membership

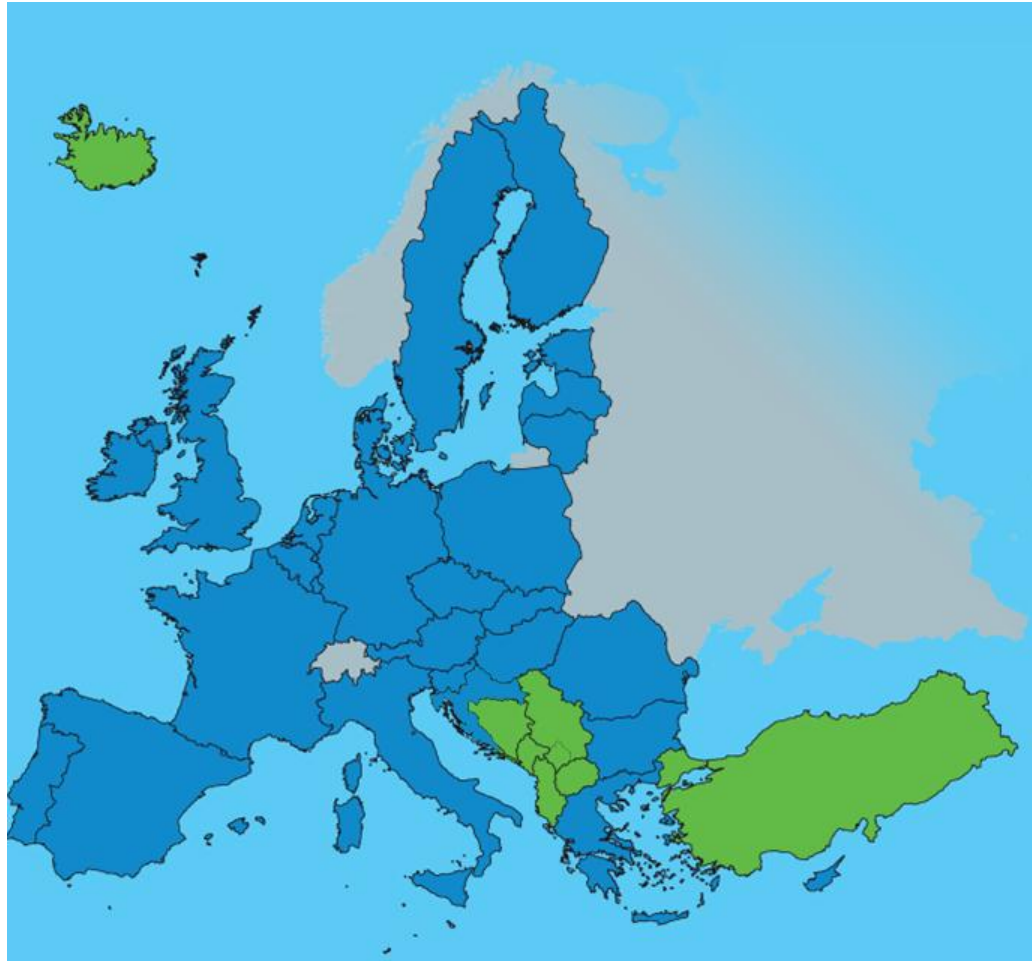

- Bosnia and Herzegovina

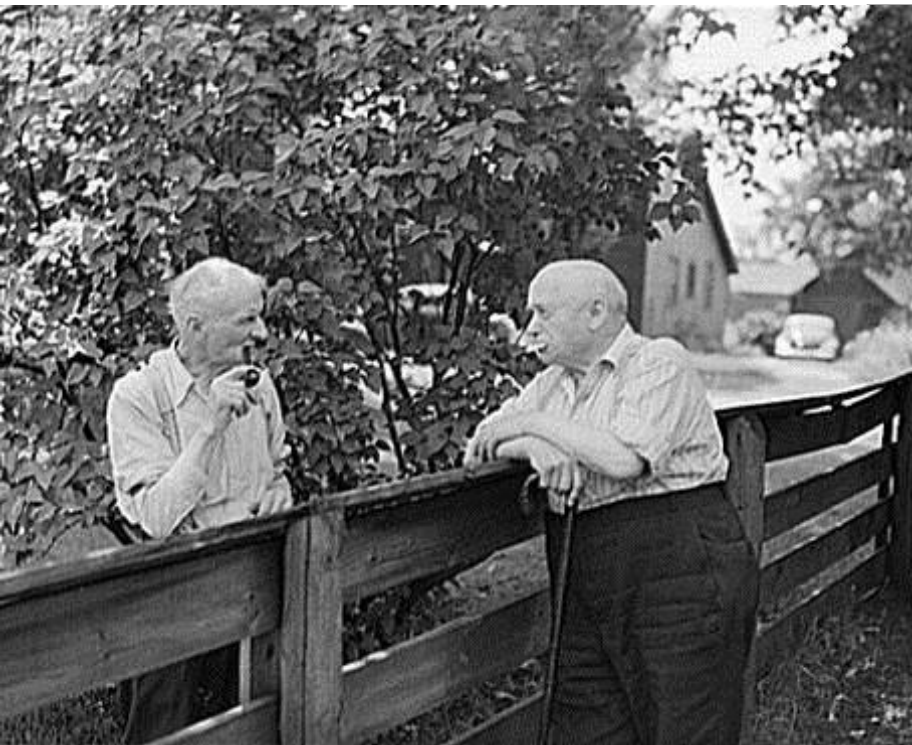
Visa dialogue launched with Kosovo*

Montenegro

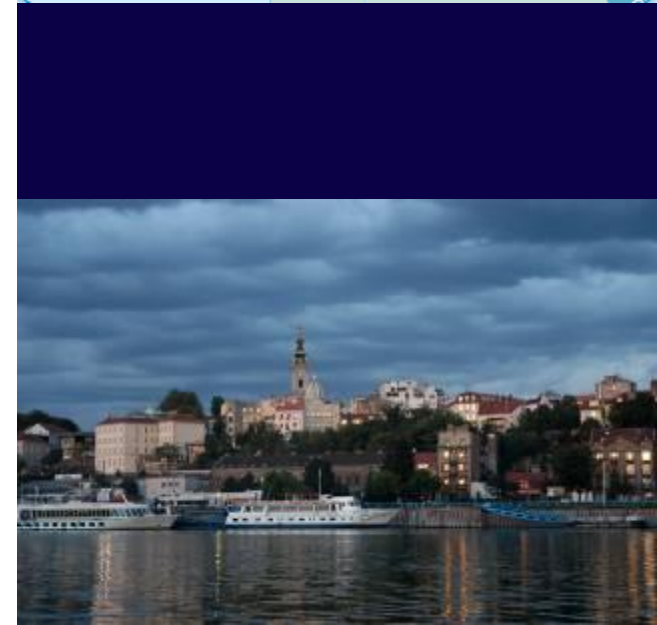
- Accession negotiations on-going
- Implementation of rule of law reforms – started
- Tangible results needed; will determine overall pace of accession negotiations



Serbia



- Pace of negotiations also depends on progress in key areas: rule of law + normalisation process w/ Kosovo
- Jan 2014 – 1st EU-Serbia Accession Conference – start of negotiations
- 2013 – historic year - Serbia's EU path
 - September: Stabilisation & Association Agreement (SAA) entered into force; start screening
 - Negotiations open – June



The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia

- EU accession process w/ the country - impasse
- Action needed to reverse recent backsliding
 - freedom of expression & of the media
 - independence of the judiciary
- Urgent need for negotiated & mutually acceptable solution to the name issue
- Government & opposition should take steps to restore political dialogue in parliament



Albania



- Candidate status in June - recognition of its reform efforts & progress
- Needs to build on & consolidate the reform momentum; focus its efforts on tackling EU-integration challenges
- Government & opposition to ensure that political debate - primarily in parliament





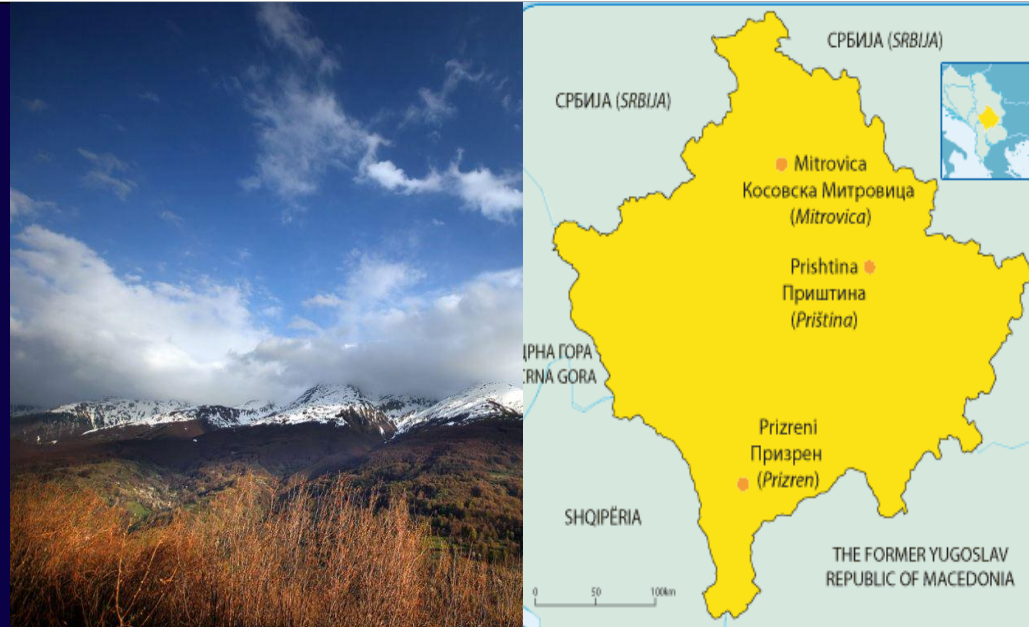
Bosnia and Herzegovina



- At a standstill on its European integration path
- Following the October general elections - essential for the country to:
 - speak with one voice
 - tackle urgent socio-economic reforms
 - progress on its European agenda

Kosovo

- May 2014: initialling of Stabilisation & Association Agreement
- Major milestone in EU-Kosovo relations
- Kosovo needs to deliver on key reforms: rule of law



Turkey



- Implementation of certain reform commitments – continued, e.g. 2013 democratisation package
- Steps taken towards a settlement of the Kurdish issue
- Still grounds for serious concerns:
 - independence of the judiciary
 - protection of fundamental freedoms
- Opening negotiations of chapters rule of law & fundamental rights would provide a roadmap for reforms in these key areas



Iceland

- Accession negotiations put on hold by Icelandic govt.
- Common interests – renewable energy & climate change → strategic importance
