# on the Annual Action Programme 2015 in favour of the Republic of Belarus to be financed from the general budget of the European Union

## THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Regulation (EU) No 236/2014 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 March 2014 laying down common rules and procedures for the implementation of the Union's instruments for financing external action<sup>1</sup>, and in particular Article 2(1) thereof,

Having regard to Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 25 October 2012 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union and repealing Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 1605/2002<sup>2</sup>, and in particular Article 84(2) thereof,

### Whereas:

- (1) The Commission has adopted the Multiannual Indicative Programme for the Republic of Belarus for the period 2014-2017<sup>3</sup>, which provides for the following sectors of intervention: 1 Social Inclusion, 2 Environment, 3 Local/Regional Economic Development, complemented by support measures to the Civil Society and Capacity Development. This Implementing Decision falls under the focal sector Environment.
- (2) The objectives pursued by the Annual Action Programme to be financed under the European Neighbourhood Instrument (ENI)<sup>4</sup> are to improve air quality management and monitoring, to improve environment permitting regulations and to better involve civil society organisations in environmental governance. The programme contains one action.
- (3) The action entitled "Strengthening Air Quality and Environmental Management in Belarus (SAQEM)" will contribute to support effective air emissions and radiation monitoring and improve environmental management, to modernize air quality and radiation monitoring infrastructure and to better involve civil society organisations in environmental monitoring and improve environmental governance at local level. The action will be implemented under direct management through service and supply contracts and under indirect management with an international organisation.

- (4) It is necessary to adopt a financing decision the detailed rules of which are set out in Article 94 of Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) No 1268/2012<sup>5</sup>.
- (5) The Commission should entrust budget-implementation tasks under indirect management to the entities specified in this Decision, subject to the conclusion of a delegation agreement. In accordance with Article 60(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012, the authorising officer responsible needs to ensure that these entities guarantee a level of protection of the financial interests of the Union equivalent to that required when the Commission manages Union funds. The UNDP is currently undergoing the assessment under Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012. In anticipation of the results of this review, the authorising officer responsible deems that, based on the entity's positive assessment under Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 1605/2002<sup>6</sup> and on the long-standing and problem-free cooperation with it, budget-implementation tasks can be entrusted to this entity.
- (6) It is necessary to allow the payment of interest due for late payment on the basis of Article 92 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 966/2012 and Article 111(4) of Delegated Regulation (EU) No 1268/2012.
- (7) Pursuant to Article 94(4) of Delegated Regulation (EU) No 1268/2012, the Commission should define changes to this Decision which are not substantial in order to ensure that any such changes can be adopted by the authorising officer responsible.
- (8) The measures provided for in this Decision are in accordance with the opinion of the European Neighbourhood Instrument Committee set up by Article 15 of the ENI Regulation,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

# Article 1

## Adoption of the measure

The "Annual Action Programme 2015 in favour of the Republic of Belarus", as set out in the Annex 1, is approved.

The programme shall include the following action:

 Annex 1: Strengthening Air Quality and Environmental Management in Belarus (SAQEM).

## Article 2

### **Financial contribution**

The maximum contribution of the European Union for the implementation of the programme referred to in Article 1 is set at EUR 14.5 million and shall be financed from budget line 21 03 02 02 of the general budget of the European Union for 2015.

The financial contribution provided for in the first paragraph may also cover interest due for late payment.

### Article 3

# **Implementation modalities**

Budget-implementation tasks under indirect management may be entrusted to the entity identified in the attached Annex 1, subject to the conclusion of the relevant agreement. The section "Implementation" of the Annex 1 to this Decision sets out the elements required by Article 94(2) of Delegated Regulation (EU) No 1268/2012.

## Article 4

## **Non-substantial changes**

Increases or decreases of up to EUR 10 million not exceeding 20 % of the contribution set by the first paragraph of Article 2, or cumulated changes to the allocations of specific actions not exceeding 20 % of that contribution, as well as extensions of the implementation period shall not be considered substantial within the meaning of Article 94(4) of Delegated Regulation (EU) No 1268/2012, provided that they do not significantly affect the nature and objectives of the actions.

The authorising officer responsible may adopt such non-substantial changes in accordance with the principles of sound financial management and proportionality.
